After months of fundraising and planning, the Barton County Young Professionals and the Great Bend Rotary Club are pleased to invite the public to the grand opening of The Tot Spot on Saturday, August 29th at 11:30 a.m. Hot dogs and refreshments will be served, and a few remarks will be made by the two organizations who spearheaded the project. All children who attend will receive a special sticker and will get the first opportunity to play on the new playground equipment.

The Tot Spot is an early childhood playground that is targeted for children under the age of five, and is centered around musical and educational elements that will encourage physical activity and early childhood development in a safe environment. With a maximum deck height of 48", this playground is designed to reduce the likelihood of injuries for toddlers. An infant learning panel also helps include the "tots" under the age of 2 who aren't mobile enough to climb on playground equipment.

The Tot Spot is located on the northeast corner of Brit Spaugh Park, next to the existing playground equipment for elementary age children, and will feature a permanent shade structure and eight benches for a comfortable experience all year round. A bonded rubber surface provides a solid padding that is safe for children to play on, smooth for strollers to roll across, and solid so that messy debris doesn't get carried home in shoes!

Great Bend Tribune Launches Community Mobile App "GB2GO" - Download Today!

Visitors to and residents of Great Bend now have a new portal to find out just about anything they care to know about the community, thanks to a new app launched by the Great Bend Tribune called GB2GO. Long a media leader for Great Bend, the Tribune has expanded beyond news to offer a one-stop shop for everything local, Tribune Publisher Mary Hoisington said.

"GB2GO is a great local resource," Hoisington said. "Whether looking for a place to stay, eat or shop or just for something to do in the Great Bend area, GB2GO includes information on everything you need."



There are community event listings, area attractions, and help information. Users can even send a digital postcard to their friends or check the local weather. GB2GO gives easy access to area business and services—anytime, anywhere, she said. Users can use the app to volunteer, see what Great Bend has to offer, and find help. There are also links to the Tribune's site for news.

GB2GO features community events, attractions, directories, news, deals, maps, turn-by-turn directions, things to do, tap navigation, social integration and more. The app was developed by the Great Bend Tribune and GBTribune. com. It is the next incarnation of the long-standing publication. The Tribune opened its doors in 1876 and has been at its current location since 1891.

The Tribune became a multimedia organization in 1996 when it developed its first website and has expanded its digital presence ever since. Now, the Tribune is introducing its first community app. GB2GO was designed based on community feedback with support and input from the City of Great Bend and Convention and Visitors' Bureau.

GB2GO's modern looks were achieved by utilizing an attractive, simplistic design that would optimize the app's functionality. The design is not purely aesthetic, but functional as well, Hoisington said. "It is a marriage of beautiful graphics with a well thought out database structure. Designed with the user in mind, GB2GO is easy to use and chalked full of great information."

The databases are continually being updated to provide the best and most

accurate information available. "Let GB-2GO be your phone book, your activities director and your best friend," Hoisington said. The GB2GO app is available at the Apple Store or Google Play and is free to download.

Hutchinson Regional Medical Center Receives Two Prestigious Awards

Hutchinson Regional Medical Center (HRMC) is the recipient of awards from two prestigious national organizations that deal with eye and organ donations.

The Midwest Transplant Network (MTN) has awarded Hutchinson Regional Medical Center the "Excellence in Donation Award" for their outstanding performance in the area of organ and tissue donations during 2014. Also, Saving Sight, one of the largest eye banks in the nation, awarded HRMC the "Excellence in Eye Donation Award" in recognition of the hospital's successful efforts in promoting cornea donation.

The awards were made as part of National Donate Life Month, which was observed in April.

MTN was established in 1975 to promote organ and tissue donations throughout Kansas and western Missouri and, for the past 40 years, has worked closely with HRMC to achieve its goal of assisting patients who wish to donate organs and tissue at the end of life.

According to MTN officials, donations from two organ donors in 2014 resulted in life-saving transplants for five recipients. Also, HRMC successfully completed 12 tissue donations, each of which may have benefited as many as 50 people.

In addition, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) within the Department of Health and Human Services in the nation's capital lauded HRMC for their outstanding record in assisting organ donors.

Rachelle Bryan, RN, Patient Care Services Supervisor, accepted the award on behalf of HRMC at a meeting that was held in May in Westwood, Kansas.

"The need for organ, tissue and eye donations has never been greater," says Kevin Miller, President & CEO of Hutchinson Regional healthcare System. "Nearly 124,000 people in the nation are waiting for an organ transplant, and 150 are added to the list each day."

Hutchinson Regional Medical Center is an affiliate of Hutchinson Regional Healthcare System. Other affiliates are Ray E. Dillon Living Center, Hospice and Homecare of Reno County, Horizons Mental Health Center, Health-E-Quip, and Hutchinson Regional Medical Foundation.

Great Bend AirFest Returns Sept. 18-20 Reserve a Ride in a WWII Bomber Plane!

The Great Bend Airfest is officially scheduled for September 18-20, 2015. As schedules are being finalized, Airport Manager Martin Miller announces early reservation opportunities for those interested in vintage warbird rides during the show. The 2015 Airfest will include 17 different warbirds, and six of these will be offering rides to the public. Early booking is available online for the B-29 FiFi, the B-25 Miss Mitchell, and the P-51 Gunfighter. FiFi is scheduled to fly in the morning each day with a range of 7 seating prices, all of which are discounted if purchased prior to the event.

The C-45, UC-78, and PT-23 are also selling rides at the event, and the airport will provide advance contact information to those wanting to reserve rides. The helicopter rides will be sold on-site at \$40/person. Miller also noted that a number of seats are already booked for this event. Those interested should go online at www. greatbendairfest.com.

Miller stated, "The size and scope of this event will likely draw visitors and riders from a large geographic area. The 2015 Great Bend Airfest is the only event in Kansas this year to feature such nationally known aircraft: FiFi, Miss Mitchell, and Gunfighter. We can expect over 100 private aircraft to arrive on Saturday due to the regional draw." Having a ride on any one of these vintage beauties is a bucket-list experience.

Additionally, this event features a "Hangar Dance" on Saturday evening presenting the nationally known "Ladies for Liberty", who will sing patriotic songs and 1940's music, accompanied by the local J Bennett Band, under the direction of Marc Webster. Anyone with experience in 40's era dances, or who has access to dance or military clothing can contact the airport office. Miller also notes that sponsorships are needed to keep the admission costs low for this event. Those who wish to honor a veteran, whether active or retired or deceased, may donate in a special category in honor of that veteran.
