SIX LOCAL BUSINESSES GRADUATE FROM SPECIALIZED TRAINING


Great Bend Chamber of Commerce and Economic Development, in association with the NetWork Kansas E-Community Partnership, recently sent six Great Bend businesses to participate in Jon Schallert's Destination Business BootCamp Community Reinvention Program in late May. The two and one-half day workshop took place at Schallert's training facility in downtown Longmont, Colorado.

“It is not uncommon for destination businesses to create change in an entire city, by drawing consumers from miles around, from outside the immediate marketplace of a community,” Schallert says. “The goal for the Destination BootCamp is to equip business owners with the confidence and tools they need to forge ahead with confidence, building a reputation that compels a response from visitors and locals alike.”



Some of the concepts covered in the proprietary training were time management, media relations, marketing and advertising, merchandising and retail displays, content writing, and much more. Schallert also provided numerous resources and helpful “hacks” to help small business owners save time and continue honing their skills.

Because Great Bend was represented as a Community Reinvention location, Schallert will be visiting Great Bend in the coming months to check up on each BootCamp graduate one-on-one. Schallert will be present a condensed overview of his Destination BootCamp content on a local level for any businesses wishing to learn more about

transforming their company into a destination small business. The E-Community team is hopeful that another opportunity will be made available in the future for another round of local businesses to attend the BootCamp at a future training event.

"I get a personal reflection out of it and it's a way for me to relax." Lueth said his time at Barton has been very rewarding. "I've enjoyed every year here," he said. "I always looked forward to coming to work and working with the kids and watching them explore music."

Lueth plans to continue teaching, performing and directing in a more limited capacity at Kansas Wesleyan University in Salina, where he plans to move.
